For all those that missed the event the San Pasqual Environmental Department worked together with the Tribal Historic Preservation office to create a public earth day event. Our primary goal for the day was to successfully carry out conservation resource related operations to provide education to the public through fun and interactive informational booths and activities. These activities encourage social engagement between the community and local environmental businesses, nonprofits and nearby tribes on their environmental efforts. Along with the main intent; other objectives of this experience include, raising awareness of the annual holiday by providing specifics of resource conservation, and to diversify participation within tribal historic preservation efforts through planned cultural activities. In order to ensure the event's success; San Pasqual tribe provided full amenities and services including; water fill stations, zero waste booth, promotional gifts that doubled as re-usable sustainable personal items, along with providing homemade zero-waste meals for attendees. With the interest of attendee satisfaction and interaction, we also sound tracked the event with family-friendly music, included youth activities and toys, and admitted raffle tickets to attendees who signed in by conducting a short survey. The raffle prizes consisted of 4 different gifts related to outdoor activities to encourage land stewardship and appreciation. Based on our survey results, we concluded this event to be a success; as we had 24 Exhibitor booths, and 146 recorded attendees. All together we believe we have met our goal and objectives for this event based on public reaction and outspoken satisfaction from numerous exhibitors.
